



TPR Curriculum Map Lent Term 2020

Year 6	<p>New Testament themes: The 12 Disciples, Lessons out of doors, The Lord's Prayer, Death of John the Baptist, preaching about the Kingdom of God, Holy Week, Jesus' Crucifixion and Resurrection.</p> <p>World Religion: Hindusim - main beliefs, origins of Hinduism, Hindu Gods – Brahma, Vishnu and Shiva, how and where do Hindus worship? Diwali, The story of Rama and Sita.</p>
Year 7	<p>The Old Testament: pupils will learn about David, Bathsheba and Nathan's Parable, the notion and abuse of power, anger, what is sin? Discuss the death penalty. From the book of Solomon, we will delve into what is wisdom and what does it take to be a good leader? We will look at Britain's national leaders and the monarchy.</p> <p>Philosophy Plato: Lessons will cover the key events in Plato's life, the purpose of his Academy as well as Socrates and The parable of the Cave. David Hume: We will look at his life, his most influential books, arguments for God's existence and Hume's objections, the Design Argument. John Stuart Mill: looking at his life, books, Utilitarianism, what are ethics?</p> <p>Faith Heroes: Martin Luther King – what is racism, does it still exist today? What are our Human Rights? How did he campaign and who opposed him? What was the bus boycott? Look at the role of Rosa Parks. What is apartheid?</p>
Year 8	<p>New Testament: Feeding the 500, what is a miracle? What do people really need to live? Modern day miracles – the Hudson River crash, miracle healing at Lourdes, France.</p> <p>The crucifixion – Sacrifice, Golgotha, Salvation, Isaiah's Prophecy, What does Jesus' death mean for Christians today? Understanding the Resurrection and evidence for it. Death – an end or a beginning?</p> <p>Ethics: Christian views on life and death - Euthanasia, sanctity of life argument, Dame Cicely Saunders, Quality of life argument. Punishment – What is the aim of punishment? Outline the world of the Prison Reform Trust. What are the arguments for Capital Punishment? Prejudice and discrimination: How do they lead to injustice, what is a multi-plural society? What is the relationship between prejudice and discrimination? Anti-discrimination laws in the UK.</p> <p>Christianity: Jesus, The Bible, Beliefs, Baptism, Prayer, Places of Worship, Holy Communion, Marriage, Holy Week and Easter, Festivals, Pilgrimage.</p>
