



## TPR Curriculum Map Lent Term 2022

### Year 3

**Philosophy:** During the first part of the Lent Term, the Children will be introduced to the idea of philosophy and will study three different philosophers from around the world. Ludwig Wittgenstein from Norway, who discussed the importance of communicating in the right way. Hypatia of Alexandria from Rome who discussed the importance of taking small steps to achieve a goal, as well as helping others to understand that everyone has the ability to learn and Friedrich Nietzsche who discussed the importance of trying things even when they might seem difficult.

**Christianity and Islam:** During the second part of the Lent Term, the children will be introduced to the basics of both Christianity and Islam and will discuss the similarities and differences of the two religions. The children will study both God and Allah and then move on to look at the festival of Ramadan and Holy Week.

### Year 4

**Philosophy:** During the first part of the Lent Term, the children will be introduced to three new philosophers: Georg Wilhelm Friedrich Hegel who discussed the power of Art to deliver messages; Immanuel Kant who discussed the importance of communication, and Michael de Montaigne who discussed the notion of loneliness.

**Christianity and Sikhism:** During the second part of the Lent Term, the children will be introduced to the basics of both Christianity and Sikhism and will discuss the similarities and differences of the two religions. The children will study beliefs and values and then move on to look at festivals including Parkash Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji and Easter.

### Year 5

**Old Testament and Judaism:** During the first part of the Lent Term, the children will study the following Old Testament stories: Ruth and Jonah and the Whale. The children will then be introduced to the basics of Judaism including values, beliefs, symbols and the Torah.

	<p><b>Philosophy:</b> During the second part of the Lent Term, the children will be introduced to two new philosophers: John Rawls who discussed the notion of fairness; Mary Wollstonecraft who discussed the need for material things and will then the children will learn about the notion of sound – is it imaginary?</p>
<p><b>Year 6</b></p>	<p><b>New Testament and Buddhism:</b> During the first part of this term, the children will continue to learn New Testament stories including the Last Supper, Jesus’s Death and Holy Week. The children will then be introduced to the basics of Buddhism including values, beliefs, symbols and the Tipitaka.</p> <p><b>Philosophy:</b> During the second part of his term the children will begin to look at Philosophy. This will be through the study of different themes and a corresponding philosopher. The themes we will study this term are; expectation, simple things in life, what it means to be normal, knowing and being polite. The philosophers we will study this term are; Seneca, Matsuo Basho and Albert Camus.</p>
<p><b>Year 7</b></p>	<p><b>The Old Testament:</b> During the first part of the Lent Term, the pupils will continue to learn about the Old Testament stories. They will study rules and law through the Ten Commandments, sin and abuse of power through the story of David and Bathsheba and Nathan’s Parable and from the stories of Solomon, they will delve into wisdom and what it takes to be a good leader.</p> <p><b>Faith Heroes:</b> During the second part of the Lent Term, the children will study the following faith heroes: Mother Teresa, Jackie Pullinger and Dietrich Bonhoeffer.</p>
<p><b>Year 8</b></p>	<p><b>The New Testament:</b> During the first part of the Lent Term, the children will continue to study New Testament Bible Stories. The children will study miracles through the story of the Calming of the Storm and the Paralysed Man. They will learn the story of the Rich Young Man and discuss material needs versus spiritual needs. They will also study The Good Samaritan and discuss the notion of prejudice and discrimination.</p> <p><b>Philosophy:</b> During the second part of the Lent Term, the children will study two new philosophers.</p>

**David Hume:** the children will look at his life, his most influential books, his arguments for God's existence and his objections to the Design Argument.

**John Stuart Mill:** the children will look at his life and works, his influential books and his ideas about Utilitarianism and ethics.

This will be followed by revision and exam preparation.
