Year 2	
Year 3	Year 3 pupils will do some more work on the ancient Kingdom of Benin before beginning this term's main topic, the Celts, who were Britain's native inhabitants before the various waves of migration and conquest which they will learn about in later years. Pupils will study various aspects of daily life, including the roundhouse, culture, religious beliefs, warriors, clothing and jewellery. All pupils will also visit the Celtic Harmony camp which brings this topic to life.
Year 4	Year 4 pupils are studying 'invaders and settlers' looking at the invasion and settlement of England following the withdrawal of the Romans and the development of Anglo-Saxon culture and society leading up to the beginning of the Viking raids and incursions.
Year 5	The main topic for the first half of term is the Early Islamic Empire. Pupils will learn about ancient Baghdad and the advanced culture that developed there as a contrast to the situation in Medieval England. We will then learn how these cultures collided in the Crusades and explore some of the consequences.
Year 6	We continue our study of the Tudor period with the execution of Mary Queen of Scots and the causes and events of the Spanish Armada. We will then undertake some project work on exploration and expansion by European nations to gain an understanding of how Europe came to dominate much of the world at this time.
Year 7	The Stuart topic continues with the trial and execution of Charles I and Cromwell's rule followed by the Restoration of the Monarchy. We will then move on to some project work based around Charles II, James II and the Glorious Revolution.
Year 8	Year 8 pupils will continue with their study of the British Empire. The main focus will be on the Scramble for Africa, followed by a study of the changing nature of the Empire and British attitudes towards it leading to the break-up of the Empire in the decades following the Second World War.
